

Electronic Monitoring of Curfew

Information for home support person



This information is about the role of the person in the home who will support the rangatahi when the court gives them Electronic Monitoring of Curfew.

What Electronic Monitoring of Curfew means

- The rangatahi must be at home at certain times. These are their curfew times.
- These times are decided by the court.
- They'll wear an electronic strap, sometimes called a bracelet, around their ankle all the time.

ELECTRONIC STRAP

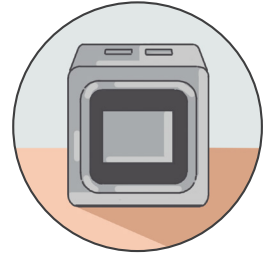


What you need to do

- Allow Corrections Field Officer to come into the home to assess, install, maintain and check the equipment when needed. A social worker will be with them.
- Make sure the base unit is always plugged in.
- Look after the monitoring equipment. Do not try to remove or damage it.

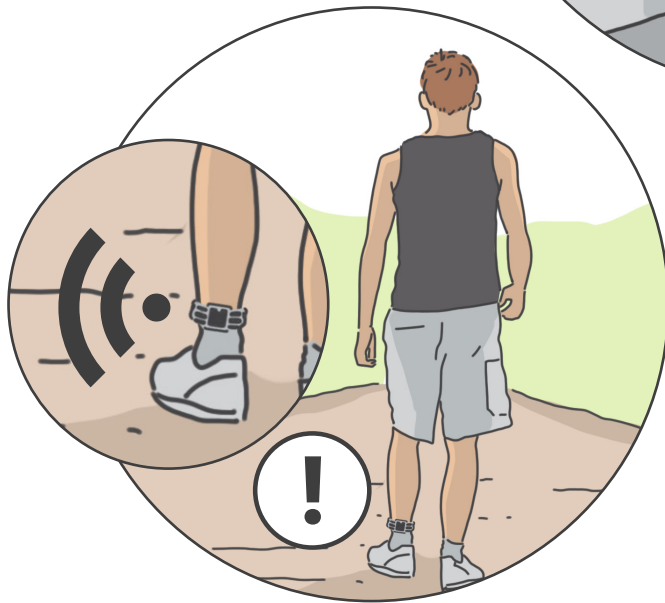
How it works

SMART BEACON

It tracks if they're at home during curfew.

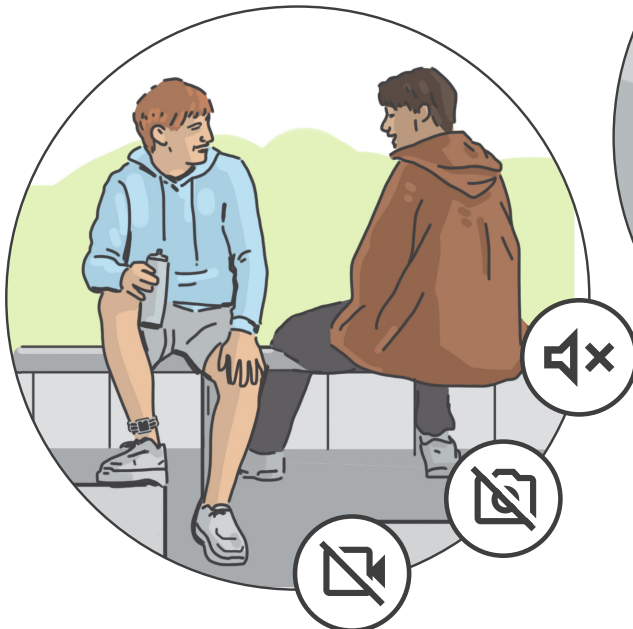


2.

It sends a signal to the Department of Corrections if they're not home when they should be.

3.

It doesn't record photos, video, or sound.



4.

It is safe and waterproof.

How you can help the rangatahi



Make sure you know their curfew times.



Help them understand what will happen if they break the rules.



Do what you can to help them stay at home during their curfew times.

What happens if they break the rules



Their social worker will be told if they're not home during curfew or if they damage the strap. They will call or visit them and you.



If they keep breaking the rules, the court might make changes to their orders and give them stricter rules.

Sign if you agree that

- You will be the home support person for electronic monitoring of curfew for the rangatahi.

- Electronic monitoring equipment can be installed in your home.
- Corrections Field Officers and Social Workers can enter your home to assess, install and maintain the strap and equipment **at a time agreed and arranged in advance with you.**

Stay in touch with people who can help

- If the rangatahi needs to go out during curfew (like for an appointment), check they have told their social worker ahead of time.
- If you know they can't get home on time, check that they have contacted their social worker or **0508 326459** and explained why.
- Encourage them to contact their social worker if something is making it hard for them to follow their curfew.
- Discuss any worries about them with their Oranga Tamariki social worker.
- If there's a power cut or a problem with the equipment from 9am to 5pm on Monday to Friday, contact the social worker. If it is after hours or during weekends call **0508 326459.**
